
# My Class is Self-Isolating Due to Corona Virus

This could feel like a long time.


On weekdays we will have school work to complete and at the weekends we can do the things we enjoy at home.







#### Tick off my self- isolation days here




Hooray I have finished my self-isolation.

If you are feeling really worried you could make yourself a worry jar.




Decorate a clean jam jar, be really creative.

If you have a worry write it on a piece of paper and put it inside the jar.



Colour a bit of this picture every day.




#### Star Breathing
